Citing Your Sources

- The works cited must be created in your Google drive
- Your works cited must be a minimum of 8 sources, including:
 - o 1 book (may be electronic)
 - o 1 news article
 - o 2 sources from databases (SIRS, Vermont on-line)
 - o 4 other sources
- Your works cited needs to be in MLA format and must include all of the necessary information.
- You need to include **ALL** of the sources you used in your paper, even if you only got one fact from the source.
- Do not include URLs.
- If you choose to create an annotated bibliography, the annotation directly follows the bibliographical entry. Your evaluation of **each** source must answer all of these questions:

• What is the goal of the source? (Examples: share or shape opinions, share information, make a profit, etc.)

o Is the source reliable? Explain why. (Consider such things as the timeliness of the information, the qualifications of the source, and the potential bias of the source)

o Was the source helpful? How did you use it?
